The result of this was that firing instantly commenced from the artillery; the shots were directed through the t pee

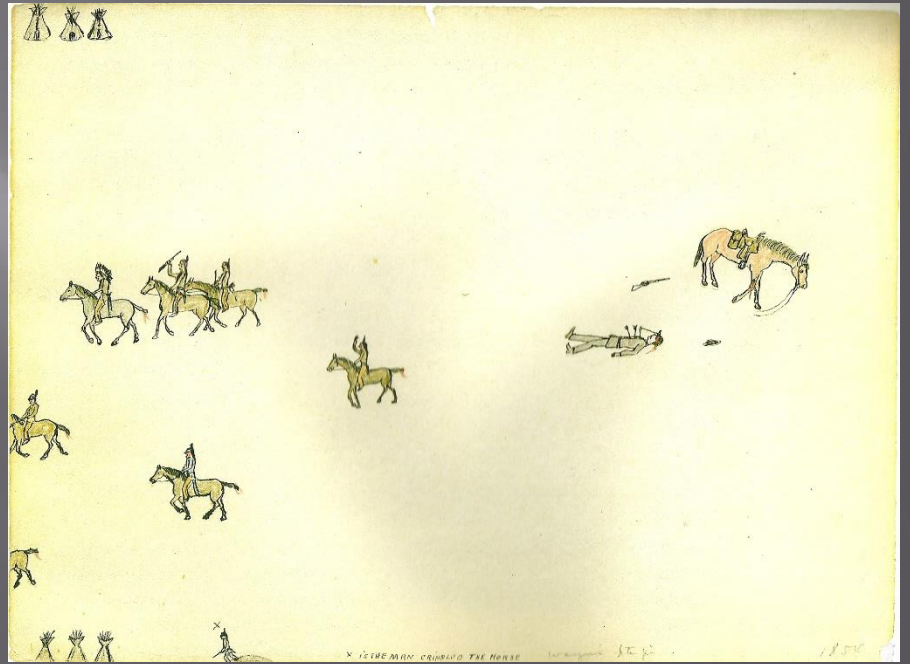
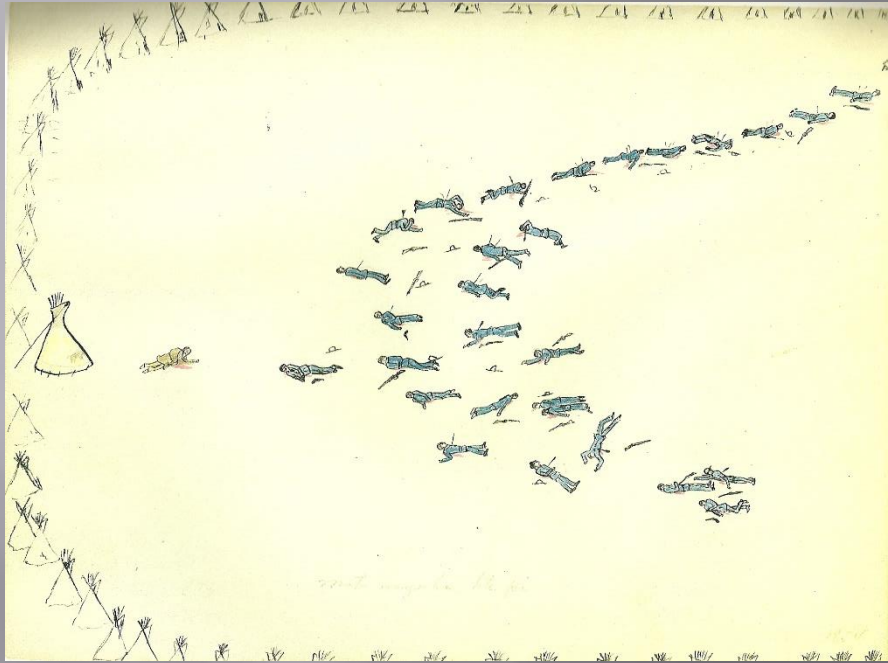


poles. The first cut down several, and the second passed through the chiefs' lodge, killing an old bed-ridden chief and wounding several of the women.

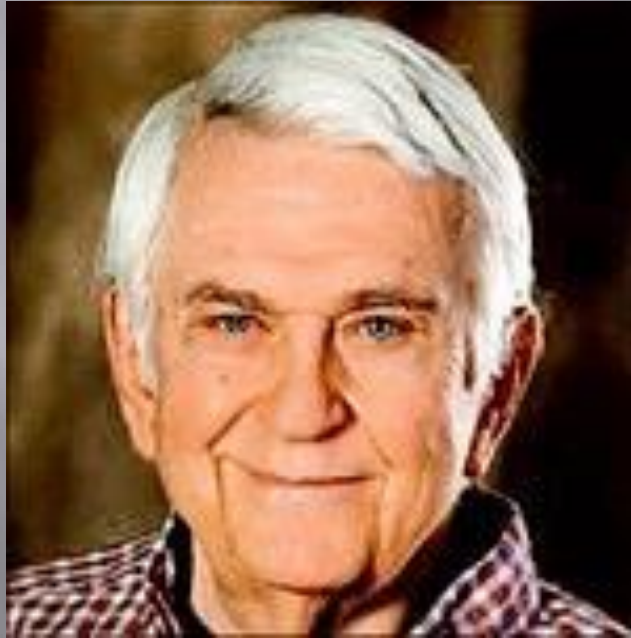

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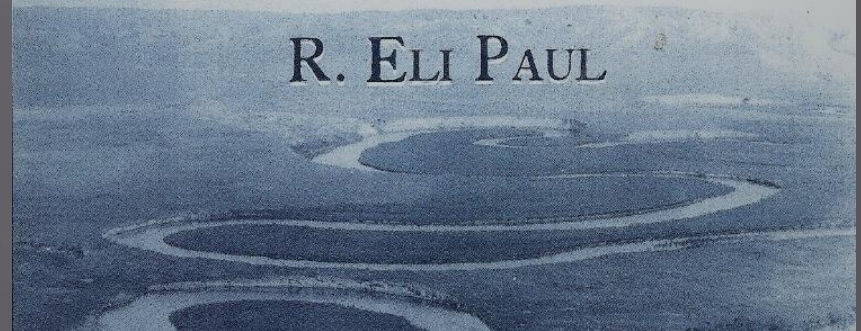

AN INDIAN KILLED A COW FROM A
MORMON CARAVAN. THE DETACHMENT
OF SOLDIERS WAS SENT TO RECEIVE
